A LETTER FROM THE MAYOR

Dear East Greenwich Residents,

Spring has sprung early this year and it's time for our Spring Edition of the East Greenwich Township Newsletter. Please take a few minutes to go through this entire newsletter for pertinent information regarding news about our town and services provided. Additionally, I encourage all of our residents to visit our web site, www.eastgreenwichnj.com, and sign up for our mailing list located at the bottom of the page. By doing so, you will receive important information about Township meetings, events, and news via our e-mail blast.

Following is an update on our three light industrial warehouses being built in Mickleton along our Route 295 Redevelopment Zone corridor. Walls, roofs, and cement slabs are being installed and erected as work continues to move forward. Two of the three warehouses have already locked up long-term leases with tenants and should be fully operational by the fall of 2020. This is great news as when the warehouses obtain their certificate of occupancies, the taxes will begin pouring into our Township revenue stream. Moreover, we continue to have further discussions with developers who are interested in investing in East Greenwich Township. I am optimistic that this trend of light industrial warehouses in East Greenwich Township is a great fit for further expansion along our Redevelopment Zone within the Route 295 corridor.

In a hot topic regarding affordable housing, East Greenwich Township and the State of New Jersey have resolved our six-year litigation over the number of Affordable Housing units required within our Township. Spearheaded by Committeeman Steve Bottiglieri and our COAH Council, we successfully renegotiated our Affordable Housing obligation from 960 units to 350 units. Furthermore, by settling our differences with the State of New Jersey, we have avoided drastic penalties to our State funding. Most importantly, we avoided a "Builder Remedy" clause that if not met could allow a developer to obtain any piece of property in town and develop that into affordable housing. For example, a developer could theoretically build a six-story high-rise building with 960 affordable units if the Township did not settle this affordable housing litigation.

We currently have three projects on the books for affordable housing: Clarksboro Commons on the corner of County House and East Cohawkin Road, Conifer project on West Cohawkin Road, and Pennrose project on Whiskey Mill Road. Being proactive with the State allows us to choose the upper tier in affordable housing projects. Clarksboro Commons is a privately-owned 300-unit, veteran preference, assisted living, Medicare bed affordable housing development. This state of the art facility will offer both private ownership and rental units for people to age in place. People will have the ability to live on their own and be provided additional options to progress through the facility as they require more assistance toward the end of their lives. Keep in mind, Clarksboro Commons determines who resides at their facility; however, veterans will have preference. Furthermore, as a private entity, Clarksboro Commons will not receive any tax discounts or reductions from the Township.

Now let's be honest – most folks understand and are compassionate that the State of New Jersey mandates affordable housing and, quite frankly, so do I as the Mayor. However, most folks don't want it next to them. The Township must comply with the State and find properties that are available for this purpose. This is challenging and means the Township must consider land it owns, land donated to the Township for affordable housing, and/or private entity-owned land. What we are doing at the Township level is selecting the best developers and concept to ensure we do not overload our schools, impact taxes, and



jeopardize the safety and security of our town. You may not like these decisions, but I can assure you a lot of thought, investigation, and hard work goes into all of these decisions. At the end of the day, I consistently do what I know is best for our Township.

In March, the East Greenwich Township Committee successfully introduced and will adopt our 2020 Budget. The budget is highlighted by an astonishing fifth year at a ZERO percent municipal tax increase. We are proud to introduce a zero percent tax for five years in a row, which is unprecedented for the State of New Jersey. I recall some years back some pundits said this was only a gimmick, but gimmicks can't sustain over a five-year period. Our message has been consistent throughout; our success is based simply on running the town like a business.

The budget consists of giving back to our exceptional employees with a well-deserved 5% pay increase. We will be bolstering our fleet with vehicles for the Police Department and pickup trucks for the Fire, Public Works, and Construction Departments. We will complete paving projects for East Greenwich Little League, Soccer, and Kingsway Youth Football. Under a NJDOT grant, we will also pave Jessup Mill Road. Additional purchases include updating and installing new cameras throughout our Township at key points at the Little League field, the football field, Thompson Park, and the Public Works garage to ensure the safety and security of our residents. We will also purchase new software for the Police Department to document evidence and new body cameras. These are a few of the exciting and outstanding items in this year's budget, again at no additional increase in your municipal taxes.

We continue to be fiscally responsible with a prudent financial management plan that bolsters our surplus, strengthens our credit rating, and reduces our overall debt. I give enormous amounts of credit to our department heads, CFO, and Township Committee for their courage and grit in putting our residents first. The Township has the tools, training, and employees to provide the highest degree of operational excellence for our residents.

Our Police Department has heeded concerns from our residents and has made addressing speeding within our community their primary mission. During the months of January and February, our Police Department stopped over 1,200 motor vehicles. We have shattered our past history for ticket infractions. Again, I urge you to set the example while driving through our town by maintaining the speed limit. Our residents are the X-factor in curbing speeding behavior. Then again, maybe a ticket will be the reminder needed to put your phone down and abide by the speed limit.

In other news, Township Committee has successfully negotiated a new five-year contract with our Police Department that improves upon our former contract which has been deemed the gold standard throughout the County. We are proud to have such a long-running contract for our men and women in blue – a true testament of mutual respect, commitment, and financial stability.

There are two individuals who have recently retired and I would like to recognize the work they have done for the Township. First, Ms. Betty Swift for her tireless efforts working for the Board of Health and the Board of Elections here in East Greenwich Twp. for the past 30 years. Regretfully, Betty has since passed. We want to extend our sincere condolences to the family and we are forever thankful for her services to our town. Fred Hills, who has been the driving force of our Environmental Team, has also retired and we wish him all the best. We are also excited to welcome Nicole Lloyd in her new role as the Director of the Environmental Team.

Finally, as I type this, we are faced with one of the most difficult times in my tenure as your Mayor with the pandemic of COVID-19 sweeping across the world. It's important that our residents know how much we learned from the storm of 2015 and how far we've come in investing in our state of preparedness. This government is prepared to overcome any adversity and continue to maintain a calmness and sense of control during a time of despair. I am so proud of the team we have assembled from the OEM, Police, Fire, Public Works, and Township Committee. The Office of Emergency Management and its volunteers are always on call. I would like to thank Anthony Rossett and all of Public Works for their continued hard work, dedication, and commitment to our town. May we keep the Police and Volunteer Fire Department in our prayers. We are thankful for everyone on the Township team, both the ones out front and the ones in the shadows, for all they do for our Township every day. We will overcome this pandemic with resiliency, only to become stronger and more knowledgeable in the future. I truly hope that when you read this, brighter days have reached us. I will be keeping everyone in my thoughts and prayers.



• **Hiring of EGPD Full-Time Officers:** On October 1, 2019, amongst friends, family and colleagues, Township Mayor and Committee swore in a new Full-Time Police Officer, Officer Michael McCabe. Officer McCabe comes to the East Greenwich Police Department as a Law Enforcement Veteran, having served as a police officer with the Woodbury Heights Police Department for the last eight years. In addition to his exemplary years of service with the WHPD, Officer McCabe comes to East Greenwich as a Certified NJ State (PTC) Instructor, a Physical Fitness Instructor, a Radar Operator and a Field Training Officer. • **EGPD to Promote New Chief of Police:**

On December 1, 2019, East Greenwich Police Sergeant, Matthew Brenner, was promoted to the rank of Chief of Police, following the retirement of Chief Anthony Francesco.

With nineteen years of Law Enforcement experience, Chief Brenner brings to this new leadership position a wealth of knowledge, experience, training and education that will lead our Police Department into a positive and progressive future.

Chief Brenner is a graduate of Highland Regional High School and has attended the Camden County College, Kaplan University, and is currently continuing his education with Fairleigh Dickinson University, specializing in a degree of Public Administration. He is also a proud graduate of the Gloucester County Police Academy's Basic Class #22.

Chief Brenner is an East Greenwich Township resident, where he has lived, coached, volunteered and has continued raising his family in our community and schools, since his hiring in 2002.

Beginning his career as a Special Law Enforcement Officer with the Gloucester Township Police Department in 2001, Brenner rose from the rank of SLEO 1 to SLEO 2 with the GTPD, eventually acquiring a Full-Time Patrolman position with the East Greenwich Township Police Department in 2002. During his time and service with the EGPD, Chief Brenner rose to the rank of Patrol Sergeant in 2009, Detective Sergeant in 2012, and ultimately rising to the rank of Police Chief this month.

Chief Brenner's experience and training is extensive, and will serve the department well into the future in leading our police officers assigned to patrol, investigative and administrative duties, as he has served and excelled in all of those areas throughout his own career. Chief Brenner established our current K9 Unit in 2004, serving as the K9 Handler of a narcotics/patrol trained police dog (Kliff). It was during this time as a K9 Handler, that Brenner worked closely with local, state and federal agencies, establishing the East Greenwich K9 Unit as one of the most decorated, and recognized Police K9 Units in Southern NJ.

It was also during his time of service prior to his promotion to Chief, that Brenner became a certified EMT, a drug recognition expert, a Field Training Officer and a certified instructor with the NJ Police Training Commission. As a certified instructor, Chief Brenner has been the lead coordinator of several Police Academy Recruit classes, training hundreds of Police Recruits during their certification to become Police Officers. In the last ten plus years, Brenner has also become a certified instructor for local and county Law Enforcement Agencies, instructing in the fields of proactive criminal enforcement, K9 Narcotics Detection and Traffic Stops.

Chief Brenner has been commended and formally recognized locally, on the county level and federally, for his work as a patrolman, K9 Officer, patrol sergeant and detective sergeant during his time with the EGPD. Some of his notable awards and recognition to date include: Gloucester County Lifesaving awards in 2006 & 2013, Gloucester County Exceptional Duty Awards in 2006 & 2011, Nomination for Gloucester County Officer of the Year in 2006, and a Commendation in 2005 by the US Immigration and Customs for his work on an investigation leading to the seizure of over 50 lbs of illicit narcotics at the T/A Travel Center.

Chief Brenner has stated that he intends to take a proactive approach to traffic and criminal enforcement here within the Township, incorporating new and advanced Law Enforcement Technology, while also bolstering community relations and programs that promote officer-citizen integration in accomplishing goals. The Chief will be incorporating new innovative training opportunities for our Police Officers, with a focus on the health and resilience of each officer, so that they can better serve our community. "I will be focusing on developing leadership qualities in every officer, regardless of rank, in order to develop a strong organizational structure that takes this department into a progressive future that our town deserves."

With Chief Brenner's "Lead from the Front" mentality, and his dedication to investing himself as the high-standard example by which our EGPD police officers will follow, we are excited to see the Chief's positive and progressive impact on our great community for years to come! Ongoing Construction Projects and COVID-19

The East Greenwich Construction office is open. As directed by the State of New Jersey:

1. All required inspections for new construction and any work on the exterior or outside of any occupied building should be performed as usual.
2. Rough inspections for new additions should be performed, provided no entry to the occupied home or building is required or that appropriate social distancing is in effect.
3. Contractors may report construction activity, such as rough inspections, in existing occupied buildings with photos or other documentation for the time being.
4. Items listed as Minor Work at N.J.A.C 5:23-2.17A require only a

final inspection. This includes inspections of replacement items such as a residential heater, air conditioner, hot water heaters. These inspections may be deferred to a later date. The contractor should report construction activity as indicated in item 3 above.

Also for CO for resale, a Temporary Certificate for transfer of title for 90 days will be done. Well & septic approvals will still be required prior to the TCO. Please see the COVID-19 Policy form on our webpage.

Please stay safe during this time of emergency.

• **New Traffic Enforcement Technology:**

In the Fall of 2019, the East Greenwich Police Department added three new SafePace mobile radar speed signs, in the ongoing effort to slow cars down, and to make our Township roadways safer for everyone. These mobile, solar-powered devices help by making passing drivers aware of their speed, with the goal that they'll slow down once they realize they were traveling too fast. The Police Department is combatting Township speeding complaints with the use of this new technology, combined with mobile and stationary patrols, for overall increased enforcement. These new signs collect real-time data, providing our officers with the time and locations that dictate optimal directed patrol enforcement.

Over the last year, the Police Department has added a stealth traffic vehicle, increased manpower, added advanced speed radar signs, and plans to implement a full-time Traffic Safety Unit in 2020. The Traffic Safety Unit will be utilizing all of these tools and advancements to promote safety and security on our community roadways, through a multitude of available enforcement efforts.

In 2019, East Greenwich Township's volunteer firefighters responded to 320 calls for service including 77 fires and 64 motor vehicle crashes/EMS assist calls; performed two automobile extrications; and responded to 52 hazardous condition investigations. The volunteers also put in hundreds of hours in training, fundraising, and community service activities.

If you have an emergency, we would like to remind you to please call 9-1-1 for assistance. If you do not feel it is a true emergency, you can also reach the Public Safety Telecommunicators (PSTs) at the non-emergency number, 856-589-0911, and they will promptly notify us to make sure you get the assistance you need.

We would like to remind the residents that we are a 100% volunteer organization. We are looking for township residents 18 years of age and over that would be interested in becoming volunteer firefighters. You will be trained

to cope with situations which range from alarm activations to home fires and rescue assignments. As volunteer firefighters in our community, we are here for two basic reasons: fire prevention and fire suppression. These are achieved through education, training, pre-incident planning, and more training. The personal rewards of being an East Greenwich Township Firefighter are broad. You may feel a great sense of accomplishment after controlling a building fire, feel compassion for helping a property owner, or feel fulfillment in teaching fire safety. The bottom line is that we are prepared for one reason, and that is to provide a lifesaving service to our community. 

The East Greenwich Township Environmental Commission and Green Team are sponsoring an open shredding event in cooperation with the Gloucester County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Robert M. Damminger, Freeholder Director:

- **Saturday, July 18 from 9:00 A.M. to Noon • Municipal Building, 159 Democrat Road, Mickleton, NJ 08056**

What to toss. Bills, once payment has cleared your account; bank and credit card statements once they are reconciled. With online banking these statements are available on the institution's web site. Investment statements if you can easily get a copy from your broker or advisor.

What to keep. Tax returns and all documentation for 7 years; all documentation of real estate purchase as well as documentation of improvements to the property for as long as you own the property.

Bring your bags and boxes of paper to be shredded. An experienced operator from DocuVault will move the disposal bins to a highly secure, mobile shredding unit where your confidential material will be destroyed as you watch. 100% of the shredded paper is recycled.

Only paper from residents will be accepted, no businesses. Please no plastic bags or metal including 3-ring binders and binder clips. Staples and paper clips are OK.

You may also bring electronics to be recycled, no TVs over 42 inches. If you remove hard drives from computers, we may be able to provide onsite destruction depending on DocuVault's truck.

East Greenwich Water & Sewer Department's 2020 Flushing Schedule

East Greenwich Township flushes our water system twice a year.

April 13 thru May 22

September 28 thru November 6

We flush between the hours of 10:00pm to 5:00am and 9:00am to 3:00pm. There will be a noticeable loss of pressure and some discoloration. Please allow water to run until it clears.

East Greenwich Water & Sewer Department is on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. If you have a water or sewer emergency after normal business hours please call 856-853-0911. This number is East Greenwich dispatch for nonpolice and fire emergencies.



Curbside Collection Information

Bulk trash: is collected the first three Tuesdays of each month. Requests must be received by 10:00 a.m. the Monday before that Tuesday's pickup. Please leave your name, address, contact number, and what items you will be placing out. (Monday gets very busy; we recommend calling by Friday 10:00 a.m.)

Extra cardboard: If you have extra cardboard that will not fit in your recycling cart, you can break it down, bundle it, and leave it next to your recycling cart. Requests must be received by 10:00 a.m. the day before your recycling collection day. Please leave your name, address, contact number, and that you have extra cardboard for pickup.

Metal/e-waste: Metal items and electronic waste are collected every Wednesday. Requests must be received by 10:00 a.m. Tuesday to be placed on that Wednesday's list.

Requests for the above can be made via (856) 423-4361 OR by registering at eastgreenwichnj.com.

Yard waste collection: Yard waste cart collection starts the first Monday/Tuesday of April and ends the first week in November. If your trash day is Tuesday or Wednesday, your yard waste will be collected on Monday. If your trash day is Thursday, your yard waste will be collected on Tuesday. During a holiday your yard waste day may be pushed to the following day. You can put your yard waste in the green cart, regular cans, or biodegradable paper bags. No plastic bags will be collected. Also, there is a yard waste dumpster located behind Public Works at 96 E. Rattling Run Road (empty loose into dumpster; do not include the bag, limbs, or branches). **We will do one extra yard waste collection on Monday, December 2 and Tuesday, December 3.** No request needed.

Limb/Branch Chipping: Our chipping schedule begins the first week of March and ends the third week of October. Limbs and branches must be placed at the curb with the butt ends facing the street. No brush shall be placed in the street. Every first and third week the Public Works department will work their way through town beginning on Tuesday and continuing until all branches are picked up. Depending on the amount of brush that is put out, chipping may continue into the next week. Limb and branch pickup is for tree and shrub trimming, not full tree removal. No request needed.

Leaf Collection: November 1 to December 20, leaves are collected curbside. For collection, please rake your leaves to the edge of your property (not into the street). Do not mix leaves with branches, trash, or garden waste. Leaves may also be deposited in the dumpster behind Public Works at 96 E. Rattling Run Road (empty loose into the dumpster; do not include the bag, limbs, or branches). No request needed.

PAINT DISPOSAL

LATEX (WATER BASED) - Not Hazardous

- Remove the lid and let the paint air dry in the can until it is no longer pourable. To speed up the process, stir in an absorbent material such as kitty litter, saw dust, mulch, speedy dry, etc. Do not place the lid back on the paint cans.
- Dried paint containers may be disposed of in your automated garbage container or placed curbside for removal on your scheduled bulk pick-up day.
- Paint should never be poured down a household or storm drain.
- Look into donating extra paint to a community paint recycling program.

OIL-BASED - Hazardous

- Oil based paints and stains can be disposed of at one of the Gloucester County Household Special Waste Collection events on June 27 (tentative) and September 26, 2020. Please call (856) 478-6045, ext. 14 for more information or visit their [website:www.gcianj.com](http://www.gcianj.com)
- Oil-based paint and stains are flammable whether wet or dry.
- Never put flammable products down any drain or into the garbage.
- Consider saving paint for a later project.

IMPORTANT:

DO NOT dispose of liquid paint in your automated garbage can. Paint will leak from the garbage trucks and ruin roadways, vehicles and/or property.
